Low Pay And High Cost Of Living

RM1,200 a month or at RM5.77 an hour

RM2,700 a month to cover just basic expenses

Unemployment factors in youths:

- Poor English
- Poor communication
- Poor character
- Lack soft skills
- Lack experience

60% of fresh graduates expect starting salary of RM3,500/month
